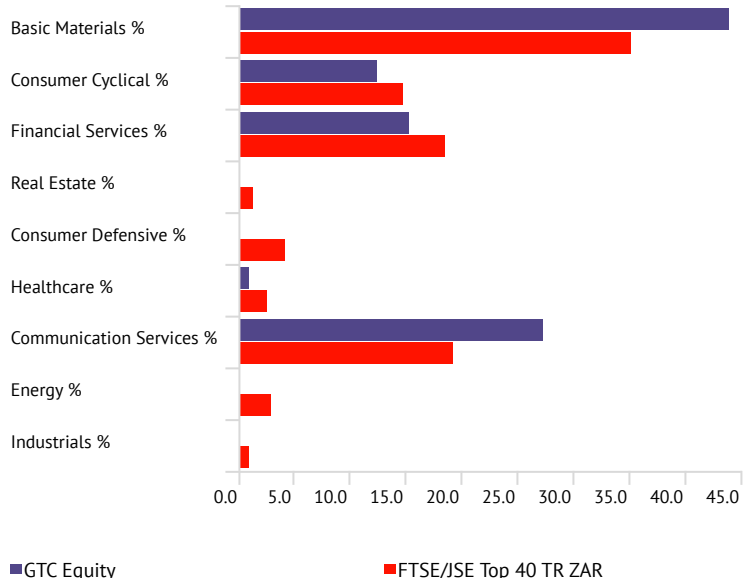

### Quarterly commentary

The local equity market (+3.2%) outperformed both developed and emerging markets in base currencies over the quarter. This was driven primarily by strong performance from Financials (+12.7%) and Listed Property (+5.9%). Local banks reported relatively robust balanced sheets and stronger than expected earnings.

Industrials (-4.3%) and Resources (-3.8%) were the largest detractors from equity market performance over the quarter as investors tried to digest the impact of Chinese regulations. Local markets were still recovering from the July unrest that took place following the arrest of former president Jacob Zuma.

The 5.5% rand weakness over the quarter propelled rand denominated developed market returns into positive territory and ahead of the local equity market.

The September chaos and sell-off in all three equity markets can largely be attributed to the more hawkish turn of central banks, deepening inflation concerns, sluggish economic recovery and tightening Chinese regulation. Severe cash flow concerns at China's second largest property developer, Evergrande, triggered global liquidity concerns and questions surrounding the health of the Chinese economy.

China's decision to further curb their gaming sector added to investor uncertainty, especially after the alarming ramifications of their EdTech regulation changes.

The manager may borrow up to 10% of the market value of the portfolio to bridge insufficient liquidity. Actual investment performance will differ based on the initial fees applicable, the actual investment date and the date of reinvestment of income. Dealing prices are calculated on a net asset value and auditor's fees, bank charges and trustee fees are levied against the portfolios. Performance is calculated for the portfolio, as well as that the individual investor performance may differ as a result of initial fees, the actual investment date, the date of reinvestment and dividend withholding tax. Recurring investment or lump sum investment performances are quoted. Income distributions are included in the calculations. Performance numbers and graphs are sourced from GTC. NAV to NAV figures have been used. The investment performance is for illustrative purposes only. The investment performance is calculated after taking the actual initial fees and all ongoing fees into account. The reinvestment of income is calculated on the actual amount distributed per participatory interest by using the ex-dividend date NAV price of the applicable class of the portfolio, irrespective of the actual reinvestment date. The portfolio charges a performance fee that is calculated as follows:  $PF = PR * (PC - FH)$  where PR = the rate of participation, PC = the daily return of the GTC Equity Fund and FH = the fee hurdle. If the GTC Equity Fund return ("PC") is less than the fee hurdle ("FH") then any shortfall will be carried forward to the next calculation period for set-off against future excesses. The GTC Equity Fund Class B charges an annual service fee of 1.06% (excluding VAT).

The Risk profile of the portfolios ranges from low risk to high risk with a low risk potentially associated with lower rewards and a high risk with potentially higher rewards. This portfolio has a high risk profile. It is suitable for medium to long term investment horizons. It has a balanced exposure to various asset classes and has more equity exposure than a moderate risk portfolio but less than a high-risk portfolio. In turn the expected volatility is higher than a medium risk portfolio, but less than a high-risk portfolio. Where the asset allocation contained in this MDD reflects offshore exposure, the portfolio may be exposed to the following risks: potential constraints liquidity and the repatriation of funds; macroeconomic risks; political risks; foreign exchange risks; tax risks; settlement risks and potential limitations on the availability of market information. The portfolio is exposed to equity as well as default and interest rate risks. The probability of losses is higher than that of a moderate risk portfolio, but less than a high-risk portfolio. Definition of the terms used to measure the risk in the portfolios a) Tracking Error: tracking error or active risk is a measure of the risk in an investment portfolio that is due to active management decisions made by the portfolio manager; it indicates how closely a portfolio follows the index to which it is benchmarked and b) Standard deviation: is a measure that is used to quantify the amount of variation or dispersion of a set of data values around the mean value. This measure is commonly known as volatility and referenced as an explicit measure of risk. One can also obtain additional information on GTC products on the website and all price related queries or information is readily available on request. Fund of funds are portfolios that invests in portfolios of collective investment schemes that levy their own charges, which could result in a higher fee structure for the fund of funds. The daily cut off time is 14:00 for trades and the valuation point is 17:00. Prices are published on Finswitch by 10:00 daily. GTC Management Company (RF) (Pty) Ltd is registered as a Collective Investment Scheme Manager in terms of Section 5 of the Collective Investment Schemes Control Act and is a member of ASISA.
